General information

Information about collecting personal data

(1) We want to use this opportunity to inform you about how we collect personal data when you use our website. Personal data involves all the data that refers to you personally, e.g. your name, address, e-mail addresses or user behaviour.

(2) The Controller in the sense of Article 4 Para. 7 of the EU's General Data Protection Regulation is Flughafen Dresden GmbH, Flughafenstrasse, 01109 Dresden, info@dresden-airport.de. Visiting our website

Collecting personal data when you visit our website

(1) If you simply access our website, i.e. if you do not book a parking space, do not register or provide us with any other information, we only collect the personal data that your browser sends to our server. If you would like to view a website, we collect the following data, which we need to technical reasons in order to display our website and guarantee its stability and safety. The legal basis for this is Article 6 Para. 1 Sentence 1 f of the GDPR – please note what is written in the section entitled "**Cancelling or objecting to the processing of your data**".

- Your IP address
- The date and time of your request
- The time zone difference compared to Greenwich Mean Time (GMT)
- The content of your request (specific page)
- The access status/HTTP status code
- The amount of data transferred each time
- The website, from which the request comes
- Your browser
- Your operating system and its user interface
- The language and version of your browser software.
- Cookies – you will find more information about this in the section entitled "**Cookies**".

Cookies

(1) When using our website, cookies are stored on your computer in addition to the data that is saved in connection with **"Visiting our website"**. Cookies are small text files that are stored on your hard drive and are assigned to the browser that you are using; as a result, particular information accrues at the point that has been set by the cookie. Cookies cannot execute programmes or transfer viruses to your computer. They help to make the Internet services more user-friendly and effective overall.

Our website uses the following types of cookies; what they involve and the way that they work are explained below:

- transient cookies (cf. a)
- persistent cookies (cf. b)

a) Transient cookies are automatically deleted when you close your browser. They particularly include session cookies. They store a so-called session ID, which makes it possible to assign various requests from your browser to the joint session. As a result, it is possible to recognise your computer again if you return to our website. The session cookies are deleted once you close your browser.

b) Persistent cookies are automatically deleted after a set period, which may be different, depending on the type of cookie involved. You can delete the cookies in the security settings of your browser at any time. The storage period for the system cookies that we use ranges between 1 hour and 12 months.

The purpose and legal basis for processing your data

We only use cookies that are technically necessary on our website. Setting and using these cookies takes place on the legal basis of a legitimate interest in line with Article 6 Para. 1 f of the GDPR. You have a right to object to this practice. You can find information about how you can object to this in the section entitled **"Cancelling or objecting to the processing of your data"**.

Deactivating cookies

Cookies can be deactivated via the settings in your browser (please use the 'Help' function in your browser to obtain precise instructions about doing this). Please note that if you deactivate cookies, this may have an effect on this and other websites.

The cookies that are set by us

If you create a user account with us, we use cookies for your login and for general administrative activities. These cookies are normally deleted as soon as you log out. In many cases, however, they are retained in order to maintain your website settings.

This site uses payment systems and e-commerce applications and cookies are essential for them so that they can work properly.

Booking procedure

Purpose and legal bases for processing

If you would like to book a parking space, you can do this by using our guest access service or creating a user account. Please also take note of our explanations about the cookies that are set if you create a user account.

1 Booking as a guest:

If you do not wish to create a user account and would like to complete your booking as a guest, we collect the data that is essential for concluding the agreement between you and Flughafen Dresden GmbH. These compulsory boxes are marked by a star and not only include your contact and address details, but also your payment data. We process this data on the legal basis of Article 6 Para. 1 b of the GDPR.

You can voluntarily enter any data that is not marked by a star. This data is not absolutely essential for concluding and fulfilling the agreement between you and Flughafen Dresden GmbH, but it enables faster, simpler and more comfortable communications, particularly if there are any queries about your booking. This data is processed on the legal basis of Article 6 Para. 1 a of the GDPR. You can cancel the consent that you have granted for this at any time. Any such cancellation affects the legitimacy of processing your personal data once you have indicated this to us. Any processing work performed up to this time is not affected by your cancellation. You can find information about how you can cancel your consent in the section entitled "**Cancelling or objecting to the processing of your data**".

Once the booking has been concluded, we send you a QR code by e-mail. The data related to your booking is stored in this QR code. This QR code enables you to enter and leave the car park that you have booked.

2 Booking as a registered user

2.1 Registration

In order to register, you must first create a user. We collect data from you, which is absolutely necessary to create a user account. These compulsory boxes are marked by a star and not only include your contact and address details, but also a password. We process this data on the legal basis of Article 6 Para. 1 b of the GDPR.

You can voluntarily enter any data that is not marked by a star. This data is not absolutely essential for creating a user account, but it enables faster, simpler and more comfortable communications, particularly if there are any queries about your booking. This data is processed on the legal basis of Article 6 Para. 1 a of the GDPR. You can cancel your consent that you have granted for this at any time. Any such cancellation affects the legitimacy of processing your personal data once you have indicated this to us. Any processing work performed up to this time is not affected by your cancellation. You can find information about how you can cancel your consent in the section entitled "**Cancelling or objecting to the processing of your data**".

We send you an activation link, which you must confirm, in order to complete the registration process. Only then can you proceed with your booking.

2.2 Booking

Once you have created and activated a user account, we collect your payment data in addition to the data that is requested during the registration process. Please note that you can process and delete the data that is stored about you in your user account at any time.

We not only use this data for the booking, but also the data that is collected as part of the registration process; this is absolutely essential for concluding the agreement between you and Flughafen Dresden GmbH. These compulsory boxes are marked by a star and not only include your contact and address details, but also your payment data. We process this data on the legal basis of Article 6 Para. 1 b of the GDPR.

You can voluntarily enter any data that is not marked by a star. Deleting your data

DELETING USER DATA

Registered users:

You can process and delete any data in your user account on your own at any time. Your user account is automatically deleted if you have not used it for twelve months. You can also naturally send us a request to have it deleted at any time. You can find the appropriate contact data in these data protection guidelines.

Non-registered users (guests)

If you have completed your booking as a guest, your data is automatically deleted 14 days after you have left the car park.

DELETING AGREEMENT DATA:

Data that is relevant to agreements, for example, accounting data, is deleted if it is no longer necessary to store it and no statutory retention periods apply. The statutory retention periods result from the German Tax Code and the Commercial Register, among other things, and they may continue for up to 10 years.

Passing on your data to third parties

None of your personal data is passed on to third parties for any other purposes than those mentioned below. We only forward your data to third parties if:

- you have explicitly given us your consent to do so, according to Article 6 Para. 1 Sentence 1 a of the GDPR;
- forwarding the data is necessary according to Article 6 Para. 1 Sentence 1 f of the GDPR so that we can assert, exercise or defend legal claims and there are no grounds for assuming that you have an overriding interest that needs to be protected in not having your data forwarded;
- if a statutory obligation exists to pass on the data in line with Article 6 Para. 1 Sentence 1 c of the GDPR, and
- this is permissible according to the law and is necessary to handle contractual arrangements with you according to Article 6 Para. 1 Sentence 1 b of the GDPR.

We pass on your data to our contract processing company in order to be able to offer you our service. The latter is contractually bound to adopt the same protective measures to safeguard your data as we ourselves do.

Summary of your data protection rights

Under certain conditions, you can exercise your data protection rights with us.

- **The right to information** about the personal data that we have stored about you according to the rules in Article 15 of the GDPR (possibly with restrictions in line with Section 34 of the German Federal Data Protection Act).
- **The right to correction** of the personal data that we have stored about you according to Article 16 of the GDPR, if this data is inappropriate or incorrect.
- **The right to deletion** of your personal data according to the principles of Article 17 of the GDPR, provided that other statutory regulations (e.g. statutory retention obligations or the restrictions in Section 35 of the German Federal Data Protection Act) or an overriding interest on our part (e.g. to defend our rights and claims) do not prevent this.
- **The right to restrict** the processing of your personal data, taking into consideration the conditions in Article 18 of the GDPR.
- **The right to object according to Article 21 of the GDPR**, on the basis of which we must halt the processing of your data. This cancellation right, however, only applies if very special circumstances exist in your personal situation – and our company's rights may possibly oppose your right of cancellation. Cf. the explanations provided below on this matter.
- **The right to data portability according to Section 20 of the GDPR**, according to which you obtain your data in a structured, common and machine-readable format and this is transferred to a third party.
- **The right to cancel any consent already provided** for processing your personal data with regard to the future. Cf. the explanations provided below on this matter.
- **The right to complain to a data protection supervising authority**; however, we recommend that you always send a complaint to our data protection officer first.

Cancelling or objecting to the processing of your data

1. Cancellation

If you have issued your consent for your data to be processed, you can cancel this at any time. Any such cancellation affects the legitimacy of processing your personal data, but only after you have indicated this to us. The legitimacy of any processing work that has taken place up to this time is not affected by your cancellation. If you have a user account, you can delete the data that we process on the basis of your consent yourself at any time.

2. Objection

(1) If we base the processing of your personal data on weighing up different interests, you can lodge an objection to this processing work. When exercising any such objection, we would ask you to state the reasons why we should not process your personal data as we have done in the past.

If your objection is justified, we will examine the situation and will either halt the processing of your data or adapt our procedures or indicate our urgent reasons that are worthy of protection and we will then continue the processing work on this basis.

(2) You can naturally object to the processing of your personal data for the purposes of advertising and data analysis at any time. You can inform us about your objection to advertising using the following contact data:
